

Biographical Information about Scott Jameson Jones

Scott Jameson Jones currently serves as the resident bishop of the Kansas Area of the United Methodist Church with offices in Wichita and Topeka, Kansas.

He was born in 1954 in Nashville, Tennessee and was raised in Tennessee, Illinois, Indiana and Colorado. He graduated from Thomas Jefferson High School in Denver, Colorado, the University of Kansas (B.A. in Philosophy, with highest honors and departmental honors, Phi Beta Kappa), and Perkins School of Theology of Southern Methodist University (Master of Theology, with high honors). In May of 1992 he received a Ph.D. in Religious Studies from Southern Methodist University. His dissertation research was focused on Wesley Studies and the History of Biblical Interpretation.

From 1986 to 1997 he served as pastor of three congregations: the United Methodist churches in Prosper, Howe and Commerce, Texas. In 2003-2004 he served as interim pastor at Stonebridge UMC in McKinney Texas. From 1997 to 2004 he served on the faculty of Perkins School of Theology, Southern Methodist University in Dallas, Texas. There he taught courses in Evangelism, United Methodist Studies and Wesley Studies. He was the Director of the Center for the Advanced Study and Practice of Evangelism at SMU and was awarded the rank of Associate professor with tenure in 2003.

Scott was ordained deacon in the Kansas East Conference of the United Methodist Church in 1978 and ordained elder in 1987 in the North Texas Conference. On July 16, 2004 he was elected a bishop and consecrated on July 17, 2004 at the South Central Jurisdictional Conference. He was assigned to serve as the resident bishop of the Kansas Area as of September 1, 2004.

In 1972-73 he was a staff person for the United Methodist Council on Youth Ministry based in Dayton, Ohio and Nashville, Tennessee. In 1978-79 he was a member of the Wesley Community at Wesley's Chapel, London, England. From 1985-1986 he served as a consultant to the Hymnal Revision Committee of the United Methodist Church. In 1996, 2000 and 2004 he was a delegate to the General and Jurisdictional Conferences of the United Methodist Church. In 2000 he served as vice-chair of the General Conference Legislative Committee on Faith and Order. For four years he chaired the Equipping Disciples Team for the North Texas Annual Conference where he participated in the development of *Bring a Friend Sunday* and *Home for Christmas*. Since 1997, he serves as a member of the International Joint Commission for Dialogue Between the Roman Catholic Church and the World Methodist Council. For two years he served as Spiritual Director of the Dallas Emmaus Community. From 1997 to 2004 he served on the Board of Directors of the SMU Wesley Foundation, being vice-chair for the last 5 years of that term. Since 2001 he serves as a member of the Executive Committee of the World Methodist Council.

His most recent books are *United Methodist Doctrine: The Extreme Center* (2002) and *The Evangelistic Love of God and Neighbor: A Theology of Discipleship and Witness* (2003), both from Abingdon Press. His previous books are *John Wesley's Conception and Use of Scripture* and *Gathered Into One: The World Methodist Conference Speaks*. He was co-author of *Wesley and the Quadrilateral: Renewing the Conversation*. He has been named associate editor of volumes 5 and 6 in the Bicentennial Edition of *The Works of John Wesley*, the scholarly edition of Wesley's *Explanatory Notes Upon the New Testament*.

Scott is married to Mary Lou Reece, who is president of Reece Construction Company. They have three children. Jameson was born in 1981; Arthur and Marynell are twins, and were born in 1984.
