Notes from the pastor.

Change

I once heard it said that the only people who like change are wet babies. There may be some truth to that. We live in a world that is constantly changing. Some changes are good. Some are not.

Even our faith, as Christians, changes over time. In Paul's letters, he reminds us that there is a difference between "spiritual milk" for those who are infants, or new to the faith, and spiritual meat for those who have grown in their faith. It is a good that that we grow in faith.

However, in the midst of all of these changes, there are some things that never change-the presence of God in our lives, the grace and love of God, and the call on the lives of Christians to love all of God's creation including the people and the natural world.

It seems that the last one has become a "hot topic" lately. So, I come back to scripture as I reflect upon it. Scriptures such as Leviticus 19:33-34 which says, "When immigrants live in your land with you, you must not cheat them. Any immigrant who lives with you must be treated as if they were one of your citizens. You must love them as yourself, because you were immigrants in the land of Egypt; I am the Lord your God." Another scripture is like it. Matthew 22:37-40 (which also references Leviticus) says "[Jesus] replied, 'You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your being, and with all your mind. This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: You must love your neighbor as you love yourself. All the Law and the Prophets depend on these two commands.'"

These scriptures do not change as time passes, or as social constructs change, or political parties or affiliations shift. They do not change as our needs, desires, or situations change. These are the call of God and the teaching of Christ to be lived out by all who call themselves Christians.
