## **Sharing our Stories**

When Jesus gathered with the disciples for the final time before his ascension (Luke 24, Acts 1), he told them that they would be witnesses to the things that he had done and that the power of the Holy Spirit would come upon them enabling them to do this.

Being a witness can mean 2 different things. First, it means seeing or experiencing something. Second, it means to share about an experience or tell someone. Sometimes, we do one or the other, but most often, we are called to do both. We witness an accident AND we report it to the police. We witness a marriage AND we sign a marriage license (if we are an attendant) or we hold the couple in prayer and walk with them on their journey. There are many other things, as well. One thing I have been reminded repeatedly of over the last couple weeks is the many reasons our witness is valuable. Of course, it can be powerful in changing lives for Jesus Christ and it is what we are called to do. But there are additional benefits! When we share our stories and experiences, it can remind people that they are not alone. Whether it is a health crisis or a life stage, to hear stories of someone who has been through it can break down barriers and be a powerful reminder that there is an end in sight. Sharing our stories can break the silence of once taboo issues and lift the health, wellness, and wholeness of whole populations of people. Sharing our stories can also make certain issues and experiences real and personal instead of being the things that “don’t happen around here” or “not something I need to think about.”

There are many issues that apply to. And as Christians, imperfect and broken, yet covered in the grace of God through Jesus Christ, we are not only called to see and experience what God can do in our lives and in the life of our community, but we are called to share our stories through the power of the Holy Spirit and to walk with others as God works in their lives!
